

Barbara A. Perry is the Gerald L. Baliles Professor of Presidential Studies studies at the University of Virginia's Miller Center, where she co-directs the Presidential Oral History Program. She has authored or edited 17 books on presidents, First Ladies, the Kennedy family, the Supreme Court, and civil rights and civil liberties, including *The Priestly Tribe: The Supreme Court's Image in the American Mind*; "The Supremes": An Introduction to the U.S. Supreme Court Justices, 2nd ed.; *Freedom and the Court: Civil Rights and Liberties in the United States*, 8th ed. (with Henry J. Abraham); *A "Representative" Supreme Court? The Impact of Religion, Race, and Gender on Appointments*; and *The Michigan Affirmative Action Cases*. In 1994-95, she received the Justice Tom C. Clark Award as the outstanding Supreme Court Fellow that year. In addition to conducting research for Chief Justice William Rehnquist, she briefed more than 3,000 visitors to the Court from 70 different countries.
