



6 TIPS for holiday fire safety

1 Turn off or unplug all electrical holiday lights before leaving your home or office, or before going to bed



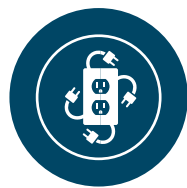
2 Never leave food cooking on your stovetop or in the oven unattended



3 Keep candles and sparklers away from combustible materials, and extinguish all candles or other open flames before leaving the room or going to bed



4 Do not overload electrical outlets, and keep all electrical cords out of the reach of children, and away from snow or standing water



5 Use non-combustible decorations where possible. Keep Christmas trees and combustible decorations away from your fireplace, space heaters and open flames



6 Do not block doorways; keeping paths to exits in the house clear can help you and your family get out safely in case of a fire
